




- Helps SAs to understand the profile of their reps, against a range of diversity characteristics.

Latest updates on the Tertiary Quality Enhancement Framework (TQEF)

What is the Tertiary Quality Enhancement Framework (TQEF)?




 The TQEF is the proposed new quality assurance and enhancement framework for Scotland's colleges and universities.

• It will seek to answer the question 'Is the provision delivered by Scotland's colleges and universities of high quality and is it improving?'

Scotland's Tertiary Quality Enhancement Framework will:



- Protect academic standards and enhance the student learning experience.
- Ensure our quality arrangements continue to be fit for purpose to support innovation in learning and new more flexible models of delivery.
- Help create seamless pathways for learners and support more students to achieve positive outcomes.
- Support more effective collaboration across colleges and universities, removing barriers to the sharing of innovation and learning, thereby promoting tertiary collaboration, where institutions wish to do so.
- Foster a **shared learning community** leading to a common language and culture around learning and teaching across the tertiary system.



Implementation of the TQEF (Phase 4)



- SFC is continuing to work with sector leads who are taking forward the development of the new arrangements through the workstreams that were initially commissioned during phase 3.
 - Self-Evaluation and Action Plan, National Approach to Enhancement, Student Learning Experience and Student Partnership
- In May 2023, SFC commissioned the Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) to lead on the design, planning and delivery of a new **external review method**. This will be a multi-year external peer-review cycle for colleges and universities and QAA is working closely with Education Scotland to draw on their expertise of colleges.
- The new approach, including the new external review cycle will be implemented from AY 2024-25, although the intention is to phase the timing of the first external reviews in colleges into the cycle slightly behind the first university reviews.

What can we expect next?



- Institutional guidance on the TQEF, including guidance to completing the SEAP and undertaking the external review method.
- Guidance on expectations for student engagement and partnership in the TQEF.
- The **Student Learning Experience model** will be embedded into course rep training. Further supporting materials will be developed to use the model in practice.
- The Tertiary Quality Student Expert Group (SEG) continues to meet monthly until June.
